

BIBLE

For those interested in Biblical studies, we offer three courses.



BIBLE DOCTRINE 41G

This course explores different belief systems about God and the Bible, and examines the major systems; political, philosophical and intellectual. The systems are compared in the light of what the Holy Scriptures say about God.



THE GOSPELS 41G

In this course the students do a comparative analysis of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, in order to better understand the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.

HERMENEUTICS

In this course the students learn principles for biblical interpretation and steps for sermon preparation.
