Two pictures tell different stories.





As a child I came from a broken CFS system, where I was passed from foster home to foster home. During this time I was introduced to various illegal activity such



as gang life and illegal drug use. At age 25 I realized that I was entrenched in addiction. I came to know Charis through a friend of my mom so I applied to the program from detox. This is my second time in the program and during my time here I have learned to grow and come to know God. I have come to know the importance of spending quality time with God, in His word and in prayer. The classes are great. They are teaching me new life skills and I am a part of study groups with the other ladies. The program and my counsellor are helping me work through my trauma and grow as a person. My goal as a mom is to be reunified with my children as I move further along in my recovery.

Resident Follow-up

Adopt a Student Program

In Matthew 19:14 Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them: for of such is the kingdom **of heaven."** We know that children have a special place in our Lord's heart. We too here at Union Gospel Mission place a special emphasis on the little ones.

The inner-city is riddled with homes full of addiction and dysfunction. One can look down Pritchard Avenue on a school day and see a number of children wondering the neighbourhood. I think to myself, why are these children not in school? Sometimes these littles ones, in future years, turn out to be the adults with addictions that are roaming our city streets with nowhere to go.

This is where the Adopt-A-Student program becomes such an invaluable ministry. We register children from North End families that do not need a hand out. but rather a hand up. From as early as kindergarten right through to grade 12 we invest the time to root students and families into the family of Christ. This is not always an easy challenge getting into the homes of families to speak the Word of God into their lives. "For we know that the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." (1 Corinthians 1:18). As I enter the homes of sponsored families, I know I'm not going in on my own strength; it's the strength of the Lord that carries me through. The seeds of truth are planted in the hearts of the little ones, which gives them a fighting chance to persevere in the adult years of life. The mission field is large and we are working on pointing people to Jesus to get saved, one soul at a time!

Good Grief!

Is grief good? Life is filled with losses and grieving our losses is good; it is necessary for one to live a life of peace and fulfillment. Isaiah 53:3 tells us that Jesus was **"A man of sorrows and acquainted with grief."**

I have been pondering this in the last 24 hours as two ladies who came by FLC to get Emergency Food shared about the loss of a child. One lady lost her 20 year old daughter 13 years ago in a car crash and she is stuck in her grief. As we talked it became apparent she had not dealt with the sudden death of her daughter and she feared falling apart should she begin the grief process. She was raised in a Christian foster home: she knows about God and has faith, but can she trust Jesus to carry her through this? That was my challenge to her - entrust this huge loss to the One who knows it. I prayed with her and advised her to get into a grief group where we come alongside each other. She was very thankful to be able to share some of her grief with me. She plans to come to FLC Bible studies and have fellowship with other ladies who are going through difficult experiences.

The other lady was grieving the recent loss of her partner and the loss of her kids' dad. On top of that, her 23 year old son was murdered eight years ago and she found it very difficult to recount the loss she felt. She also was invited to our FLC programs, to hear about Jesus the Savior from sin and the Wounded Healer.



Marlin tells me he speaks with the Lord all the time and he knows it's God directing him to FLC to receive fellowship and prayer.

Drop-in Street Ministry

It was weekend drop-in and a stranger to UGM came by for some sustenance. He wore a bandana of sorts around his head, was carrying some kind of shoulder bag and was covered in dirt. He reminded volunteer Joanne of an archeologist. He approached Joanne and mumbled 'yes' in response to her offer to give food and tea.



Moments later he shuffled over to her and placed a diamond cut piece of glass on the counter and gestured she receive it. Minutes went by and then our guest reached for his bag and poured it's contents on to the table in front of him. Dirt, earth, pebbles and rocks covered the table. Joanne's first impressions of her new friend were not far off.

He began sorting stones to one side. As he did this, he started to cry and then weep. Joanne, moved by the sight and sound, went over to him. She sat with him and asked him about his treasure. In his world, he was sorting treasure. The responses were muted. Joanne asked if she could pray with him and despite another muted response, she placed a gentle caring hand on his shoulder and prayed.

Then something extraordinary took place. Under his breath the visitor muttered over and over. 'the least of these. the least of these'. Joanne was struck by the poignancy of these words and later that day re-read what Jesus had spoken, as recorded in Matthew 25:42-45. It says, "for I was hungry and you gave Me no food; I was thirsty and you gave Me no drink; I was a stranger and you did not take Me in, naked and you did not clothe Me, sick and in prison and you did not visit Me.' "Then they also will answer Him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to You?' Then He will answer them, saying, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me.'"

No longer does Joanne need to wrestle with the value of her serving, for truly she serves our Lord Jesus every day.

Street Ministry

Chapel services for our street guests prior to a meal are often moving and powerful. Recently Chaplain Carel shared the story of a few minutes spent with a guest in a wheelchair. He was a man who had lost a leg in recent times. Carel was sensitive to the Holy Spirit's leading and could see he was struggling and that this man had unforgiveness in his heart. As Carel shared the Lord's own beautiful and freeing example of forgiveness, he could see that this man's eyes and heart were connecting and receiving what Jesus had for him.

The two men were together moving in the moment, unknowing that the words of Jesus were exactly what were needed to be heard. Here was a man, probably in his 60's; a man who had been through the school of life; a man with a heart of stone, receiving words of life and insight and the beginnings of the Master Potter reshaping one He loves. Isaiah 64:8 **"But now, O Lord, You are our Father; We are the clay, and You our potter; And all we are the work of Your hand."**

OH, how Jesus loves!
