Divine Appointment

It was a cold and rainy October evening. The day was done for me and it was quitting time. I was exhausted and looking forward to snack and my warm bed. As I walked out of the Mission I literally bumped into a young man. He was barefoot and wearing nothing but shorts and a muscle shirt. Had I left work 5 minutes earlier or later I would have missed this man entirely. I believe in something called divine appointments. This encounter was no accident.

I invited the man (let's call him Ron) inside to warm up for a few minutes and we provided him with a bowl of hot soup. Ron had just moved from Regina to Winnipeg and had no idea where any of Winnipeg's social services were located. That night I listened as Ron told his story of a cross country journey always looking for a home, always looking for hope,

but never finding it before he moved on. Together we joked that he was like the character from "The Littlest Hobo," a TV show we both watched as children.

That night we fed Ron, we allowed Ron to shower, we clothed Ron. We brought him up to speed on what Winnipeg had to offer a young man in his situation. In short, as Jesus commands, we took care of him physically. However, at the same time, because Ron saw our genuine desire to care for him physically, he allowed us to care for him spiritually. As I shared the hope of the gospel with him I saw his eyes grow HUGE!!! "How come no one has ever shared this with me before?" he asked. "I'm sharing it with you now," I said.

That divine appointment and the physical care that you provided by supporting UGM led to a spiritual victory. Ron will join us in Heaven. Thank God for His perfect timing.

Joe

Joe had tried the recovery program at UGM a number of times, but giving his life to the Lord Jesus Christ was something that he struggled with. The thought of trusting his life to God and surrendering everything to Jesus was something he would hold back on every time. He did not want to lose control of his life too much. But then a tragic loss came into his life and he was desperate for peace in the midst of all the grief he was feeling at the death of someone close to him. As a result, all the resistance he had to the gospel fell away and he finally surrendered his life to Jesus. Ever since then, Joe has found the peace he has been looking for all his life and the joy of salvation that on Christ can provide.

Today, Joe has made it through the recovery program and is serving at the Mission. He wants others to know about Jesus and how Christ can bring peace and hope into even the darkest of circumstances. Many of the street guests who come to the Mission are in seemingly hopeless situations and need the hope that only Jesus can provide. Joe knows through personal experience that this hope is real. One of the passages from the Bible that Joe cherishes is from Hebrews 13:5 where the Lord says, **“I will never leave you nor forsake you.”** After giving his life to Jesus, Joe knows now that Jesus is faithful to this promise and he will never be alone again.

Breaking the Cycle

She works so hard to keep it together. Day after day, the struggle is real and she is not sure where to turn. She knows God loves her, but she does not always feel it. She is not even sure why He would love her because she always feels she is not good enough. Why does this recovery journey keep getting more difficult? Why does she keep slipping? She knows that there are people who want to help but they feel so far from her grasp! The words “I need help” just can’t seem to roll off of her tongue when she needs to say those words the most. Who is she? She’s a mom, a daughter, a friend. She loves her children so much, she wants better. But she just can’t....

Her workers see her struggle. They try to reach out, but she denies that she needs it. “Everything is fine”, she says. They know it is not. Her attitude is slipping, she is missing

classes and she looks depressed. They know she is not doing well. They pray for her. They remind her that they are there and that she has support; she just needs to accept the help. They tell her to start to talk about the trauma, because without dealing with it, she cannot heal. She denies the trauma. Everything is fine! Until that day when she can no longer hold it together. Once again, she relapses. The drugs have taken over and once again the addiction is controlling her life. Once again, she is at the bottom looking up, knowing that she's starting over.

This is the reality of many of the women that enter into our program. Despite their best efforts, they become overwhelmed with life and find themselves at the bottom again. As we care for these ladies and invest in them, this process is difficult to watch. We see their potential; we hear about the demons they face every day; we hear the hurt and the pain; we know of the nightmare that they have lived.

The answer to the struggle is Jesus. No matter what the circumstances that we face in life, no matter the difficulty, Jesus is there to walk beside us, to go before us and to defend! He is our strength. We pray that the residents at Charis learn to give Jesus the brokenness and allow Him into the process of healing.

She fell asleep and awoke in peace without the after effects alcohol usually had on her. Her life was changed. In 2001 she sought out her husband who abandoned her and told him, "I forgive you."

When Bradley came to the door, I felt he should have been invited in, and prayed for.

Garth (1 leg) I have seen before, with his friend (wife?), Sandy . Always want bread... thin, gaunt.

Austin, Kelly (again and again), James, Alfred, lost souls.

Clifton, looked like he hadn't bathed in months.
