Through the conversations and home visits that I have had, grandparents are torn over the fact that their children are in no position to raise their own children. There have been times that the biological parent shows up after being away for some time and wants back into the life of their child. At times, this is very good, because the parent has cleaned themselves up due to an addiction or some other affliction. However, there are times where the parent trying to reunite, creates more havoc and undoes the solid ground that has been built.

This year, we have for the first time Great Grandparents are raising their great grandchildren. When I first met with Great Grandma, she was very determined to have her great grandchild enrolled at a Faith based school. We had a wonderful chat and prayer time about the struggles and challenges that her and her husband face. We talked about the past struggles of Residential School and 60's scoop that she and her husband went through. To my amazement, she talked about the forgiveness that was needed to take place in

order for healing to occur. This great grandmother has much wisdom!

Then she spoke of not having the answers on how to raise a child in the year of our Lord 2023. As a regenerated Saint, she sees the darkness all around us, as we continue to live in a fallen world. She is concerned of going home to glory before the great grandchild enters high school. At this point all I could tell her was to continue to trust in the Lord and lean not on our own understanding.

FLC CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Deeper Faith

Praise the Lord for all He has done and the work He continues to do with the children we minister to! Recently, we have had anywhere from two to twelve children attending our after school clubs. We have been introducing new group games to the children so that we have something new to look forward to each day. Some of these new games have

become their favourites and they want to play them daily.

We have noticed that many children have started to become disengaged during our Bible lesson time, regardless of the format or how interactive the lesson is. We've had many opportunities to have one on one conversations with the children and youth attending club, which has proven to be impactful. We have been able to connect with them on a deeper level and they are more comfortable asking questions and talking about challenging topics without the presence of their peers.

We had an incredible summer in the Camp Ministry this year, with 1367 children and youth attending a Bible camp. Of those 1367, 165 made a first time commitment to Jesus and 305 either recommitted their lives to Him or noticeably grew deeper in their faith throughout their time at camp. Over the summer, eleven children and youth were baptized upon the confession of their faith!

Hope in the LORD

In June 2018, when I first came to Family Life Centre to oversee the Women's Ministry program, I met many women. One of the women at Ladies Day on my first Wednesday was Candy (not her real name), she had three young sons and the youngest was a toddler. They lived across the street from FLC and the two older sons attended the Children's Program that happens at FLC, so I got to know them well.

Candy attended regularly with a group of friends. She had a quiet demeanor but she never had a positive response to the Gospel that was presented to her many times. In March 2019, Candy stopped attending FLC. The story is that she allowed bad company into her home and she was evicted due to partying and drug use. The next dwelling place did not last long either. As her drug use increased, she lost her children and became homeless. When she received government money due to covid, she spent it

all on drugs and her life spiraled downward.

Fast forward to Ladies Day July 5, 2023, when a woman claiming to be Candy walked through the doors. We didn't recognize her. She is gaunt, with short dark hair and wearing a ball cap. Her behavior is disruptive and argumentative. She was obviously suffering from drug-induced psychosis. She again attends Ladies Day regularly and the staff strive to be patient with her behavior, which sometimes causing anxiety to other guests. **Pray for us!**

I have been questioning God whether Candy has hope of freedom and healing from this drug. Then I heard Richard's testimony at our UGM banquet and yes, in the Lord Jesus, there is hope!

Fall Update

Wow! God has answered our prayers for more students and more consistent attendance! September saw 6 to 12 students per period, not to mention more prospective

students for mid-entry later this term. ***Please pray that attendance and participation will remain strong.*** One of our students has asthma brought on by the cold - a miracle is needed. ***Please pray for the physical/mental/spiritual health of all students!***

A new computer coding class began in September. ***Please pray for me to have wisdom as the instructor and for the first and only student so far to have growing knowledge and skill.*** Over the summer and even now, teachers are preparing new courses to offer in January (Family Studies, Work/Life Transitioning, Bible 41G). The ***Bible course requires approval from the government,*** which we have been waiting on since September - ***thank you for your prayers in this matter!***

Because I have been busier as a teacher and as an administrator due to some ***unforeseen technical issues requiring resolution before the end of November (please pray)***, it has been a great blessing to have a valuable and dedicated volunteer. Phil started at the end of last school year and worked throughout the summer to develop and begin implementation of new office systems. Given the high 'one-on-one' needs of students along with more attendance, teachers also feel pressed at times. I trust that in the future, God will prompt others to also reach out without being asked (like Phil) and that these new volunteers might be passionate about tutoring students one-on-one,

towards completion of their courses within the required amount of time. Working with volunteers takes time but is worth the effort – ***please pray for more helpful volunteers.*** This includes the need for volunteers to help with a major provincial initiative called **MALLA - Manitoba Adult Learner Literacy Assessment.** ***Please pray for me to consider how to apply MALLA most helpfully.***

At a recent professional development session, we discussed the need for discernment. In this age of social media, when social media platforms select content – even spiritual content – based on our initial and frequent choices. A consequence of this can be that it is very easy to surround oneself with online resources that offer one-sided or incomplete considerations. It is so important for all of us to have knowledge that comes straight from the Bible, so that the Holy Spirit can enlighten our understanding with His truth. To that end, we will continue to invite our students to read directly from the Bible – during our daily in-class devotion times and in our Wednesday chapel times. We will continue to post scripture above the coffee station and take the opportunities that arise during class

discussions to point our students towards God's Word. ***Please pray that students will be prompted to share from their heart and pray for their own needs and for each other.***

It was great to meet so many of you at the October 14 banquets. I recognize that many people reading this may have been unable to attend – your prayers and support are not taken for granted! That said, I found this team building event to be valuable for many reasons. I trust that through more events like that, or by way of the UGM 'Our Father Who Art in Heaven' video, or newsletters like this, that you will be blessed and hopeful as we look into the next decade towards UGM reaching its 100th year of witness for Jesus and service to the least, the last and the lost.

A guest speaker delivered a wonderful meditation on Psalm 23 and I trust that over the course of this next year/decade, we will all experience and affirm God's guidance and guarding in every way!

Hello! I am Karis and I am currently interning at the Charis Centre through Millar College of the Bible. If you are reading this, that means you may have a bit of an interest in what the Lord is doing through the Charis Centre. In that case, then that's great because God is doing some amazing things at the Charis Centre and we as a staff at Charis Centre are thrilled and humbled to be a small part of God's plan for the ladies here. God is doing amazing things in the lives of these ladies. These ladies have experienced and done things that I cannot even imagine. They come from very dark worlds where Satan's lies run rampant. Yet, these ladies have somehow ended up at Charis Centre which has led many of them to the foot of the cross of Jesus Christ. Many lives truly have been transformed and I know that God is not finished with them. These eighteen ladies are only eighteen stories out of how many in Winnipeg? Hundreds. There are hundreds of people facing the same if not worse things than these residents. The cycle of addiction is horrendous and seemingly hopeless. Nothing is impossible with God though and he has brought many out of that cycle and has brought them to Himself.

One resident in particular had been a unique example of God's transforming work. Angelina comes from a rough home life and unfortunately, made home life hard for her kids. Through a series of circumstances, she is now

here at the Charis Centre. God has taken a hold of her heart stronger than anything in her past did. She has surrendered to Christ and dedicates much of her time to studying God's Word, memorizing Scripture, asking questions and even started a prayer group with a few other ladies at the Centre. Angelina is far from perfect and still has her daily struggles. Yet, she is striving, learning and growing, which is all God ever asks of any of us.

Over these past few months, I have realized that you or I are not so different from these women. All are born into sin. Sin corrupts everyone and everything. All fall short of God's glory because of sin and yet God offers salvation, grace, and forgiveness to you, these women, and me. No one is too far gone for God's grace because no one is deserving of God's grace in the first place – that's the amazing thing about grace, God still offers it. Testimony of a Resident at Charis Centre - By Tania K.

Today has been 3 months since I took a leap of faith, but not in a religious sense. Drugs and homelessness had taken everything from me and driven me to insanity. I had nowhere left to turn and no one left to trust. First, I threw my phone over, I could have called someone for help, but I was done. Defeated. Depressed. After I threw my phone over, I threw myself over. I felt myself drowning for a few seconds, my lungs filling with water, my body being summersaulted from the current. I had attempted to end my life. It was when I resurfaced that reality hit me. It didn't work. I was still alive and still stuck with the same problems. Something carried me in the water that day. I barely had to tread to stay upright. The current down there was strong but it wasn't strong enough.

From here, I began to undergo treatment from a psychiatric facility, to my own accord. From there I transferred myself to a 1-year drug rehabilitation center where everything started to come together. I began to get my Metis status, doctors, dental, financial stability, stable and affordable housing, ID's and medications. Things that aren't materialistic started to develop as well; grace, comfort, self love, self respect and patience. I am truly grateful for all of it and a second chance at life. By the time I turned around and seen all that God had done for me, I was amazed and extremely grateful. At Charis, I found hope and God and a chance at a new life.

Road Trip

Do you remember those long sleepless road trips you took as young men or women? The sleepless nights. The coffee. The rest stops along the highway. The songs on the radio. The most amazing and intense conversations?

One of our residents was facing an old court case in Saskatoon and had to find a way to get there. The problem was that the only bus leaving for Saskatchewan left on a Friday and the court date was for Wednesday, which would leave our resident homeless on the streets of Saskatoon for several days.

After several hours on the phone, we could not locate any social organizations willing to house him safely on a temporary basis. I cannot emphasize enough the dangers of this situation. The gentleman was

so new in his recovery that to spend any time on the street meant a certain relapse into his addiction, if not something worse. In fact, I was certain if he got on the bus, I would never see him alive again. That is not an overstatement.

In a moment of clarity, I believe the Spirit of God had me call the residents lawyer in Saskatoon. “He will be in court on Wednesday because God wants me to drive him there.” Surprised, the lawyer asked me if I was sure. Shocked that I had offered, I said “Yes. Completely sure.” The lawyer then offered to call me right back. 5 minutes later he called and said, “We don’t do this, but my firm has decided that if you are willing to drive your resident the 8 hours to Saskatoon for court, we will pay all the expenses for the trip!” The lawyer had been touched by God!

At 1am on Wednesday, we left for Saskatoon. Hours in the car led to the most incredible spirit led conversations and prayers. After breakfast in Saskatoon, we arrived at the court. At 10am on the same day, the judge **threw the case against him out of court and dismissed all charges.** After a hearty lunch, 8 hours on the road back to Winnipeg, and even more praiseworthy conversation, we returned to Union Gospel Mission 320 Princess St. praising God and giving Him glory for the most amazing 24-hour road trip we had ever experienced at the hands of the Almighty!

It Hurts Us All - Drug Abuse is a Crime

Time: 06.50 hours – Tuesday October 10, 2023.

Temp: -2 Degrees C

Location: A 25-Meter radius of UGM, 320 Princess Street

Scene: Dark. Two persons sleeping beside our building, no roof overhead. Two tents on the sidewalk, on Princess Street opposite our neighbours. One tent has a fire burning inside. There is plenty of vehicular and foot traffic, this early in the morning. Needles of death are scattered where Henry Avenue crosses Princess Street.

Action: To don blue plastic gloves and very gingerly collect the used needles of death. There were, horrifyingly 31 needles. Yes, thirty-one!

Reaction: To be appalled. To hurt for the 31 recipients of the opioids plunged into the bodies of recipients. Creations of Jesus that the Creator had knit together in their mother’s womb, regardless of the circumstance of inception (Psalm 139 v 13). Someone’s dad, mom, brother, sister, boyfriend, girlfriend, the list goes on. The passersby ...do just that... pass by. The traffic, despite their lights falling on the needles, continues on. The people in the tents, the people sleeping on the sidewalks are largely anonymous, but not to Jesus. Each one is known to Him and precious in His sight.

Then comes the anger. Anger at the purveyors and dealers of drugs. Anger at a clueless world that seems to facilitate drug addiction. Feeds it almost! Then the hurt again. Those who are caught “jonesing” (desperately seeking another high or extreme low). To forget. Hurt.

Painful Encounter: Later that morning a beautiful young mom we have gotten to know stops by to visit. A former man in the program is her common law husband. Frequent visitors to the door, they are trapped

in an endless cycle of ‘using’. Today her two kids are with her. Other times they are with CFS. Back and forth. She talks “I simply cannot resist crystal meth. I see a needle; I have to inject meth into me. There seems no option. It has an iron grip on me”. Tears come to the heart. “Do you know Jesus?” she is asked. She says ‘yes’. The reply to her is “then before you plunge a needle into your body of possible death to yourself, remember that Jesus took the cruel nails of certain death that pierced His body, so that you might live”. More discussion followed. Prayer.

Solution: Nobody but Jesus. Your love and prayers. Nobody but Jesus!

A Book Like No Other

Richard comes to Chapel every night. He is only thirty years old but already has experienced the frightening reality of homelessness. His heart is heavy with the weight of his past mistakes and does his best to fight off the darkening clouds of depression that threaten to overwhelm him.

He volunteered at the UGM thanksgiving banquet just for something to do. Something stirred inside of him as he worked alongside staff and volunteers. For the first time in his life, he saw faith in action. The delicious food and the warm atmosphere were great but there was something else, something deeper that he sensed in the place that was missing in his own life. As we sat together and talked, he began to open up about the turmoil he was experiencing inside.

He grew up in a works-based church and experienced a lifetime of feeling unworthy and unable to satisfy this demanding God. Feeling discouraged and disillusioned, his life drifted towards drugs and alcohol. This seemed to be the answer at first, but soon he was left with the same emptiness as before, only now he was broke and homeless as well. Desperate, he asked his Mom for a Bible but was told that the church did not hand out Bibles randomly, they had to be earned.

I encouraged Richard to continue searching and his eyes lit up as I

handed him a Bible. He assured me that the Bible was a book like no other and he knew that he would find the answers he was looking for. I was truly humbled by this experience and blessed to be able to share God’s word with my friend and brother in Christ.

is John, (not his real name). We met a year ago when I dropped by Union Gospel Mission. I was addicted and needed help. I asked you to pray with me that I would be able to get into Detox.”

Note: Detox is a 10 – 14-day program in Winnipeg where addicted men and women go to get drugs/alcohol out of their system before entering longer term treatment.

“Ed, I got into detox almost right away! Then I got into treatment. Now I am in a Sober Living House and I have been sober for one year! It’s been bugging me for months to call you and let you know I didn’t die!” We talked for a while, and I said a joyful goodbye to John, inviting him to call or come by for coffee anytime. I spent the rest of my day praising the Lord!

These are the kinds of miracles I see every week at Union Gospel Mission. Thank you for your prayers, because they literally save the lives of people like John!

Two Sundays and Two Strays

This little kitten had come through our yard several times during the summer months. Each attempt to gain her trust was met with her running away under the neighbour’s stairs. However, on this Sunday, on

the last long weekend of summer, my daughter's cat call peaked her attention and she timidly came towards us. It only took a few strokes and some dry cat food to gain her affection. She never left our yard that beautiful summer night. She curled up on a chair next to my husband as he watched baseball and I worked around our yard. It was late when we went in, leaving our stray friend sleeping soundly. Expecting her to be gone in the morning, she was not. Little Sadie made her way into our hearts and home.

Every week my husband and I pick up three sisters, whom I have known since they were young, and bring them to church with us. They live in a very difficult part of Winnipeg. The Sunday after Sadie joined us, we were dropping them off, as we always do, behind their house. Behind their garage sat a woman, with a colourful scarf on her head, weeping into her hands. I walked the girls into their home and went back to check on the lady. As I approached her I asked if she was okay and if I could help. As she looked up from her hands, the scarf fell back off her head and I stepped back in shock. Her head was shaved and her face was full of sores. She was gaunt and filthy and reminded me of pictures of people in concentration camps. What I thought was her sitting surrounded by garbage was actually her sitting surrounded by her possessions. I could tell, by her responses to my questions, that she did not trust me. My presence annoyed her. I gave her some food and left her, asking the Lord to protect her.

As I met with the Lord the next morning I continued to petition for this lady. I looked down at Sadie who was curled up and content beside me and thought, "Two Sundays and two strays." A stray? Who was I to call a human being, one so desperately in need, a stray? I was ashamed of myself. Ashamed and wondered why it was so easy to take in a homeless cute kitten but so difficult, and scary, to approach a homeless and broken person.

As I pondered these "Two Sundays", I thanked the Lord for His work at UGM. After many years, 320 Princess is now fully staffed with daytime, evening, and weekend missionaries, providing Winnipeg's street community with a loving, safe and consistent environment and most importantly, God's Word, which gives hope. In addition, praise God, where we as human beings fail, His hope never does, nor does it disappoint.

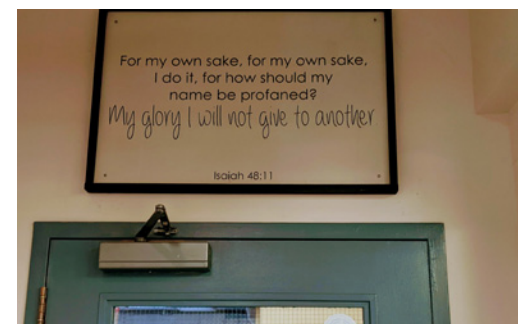
