

The Light Sings In The Darkness And The Darkness Has Not Overcome It

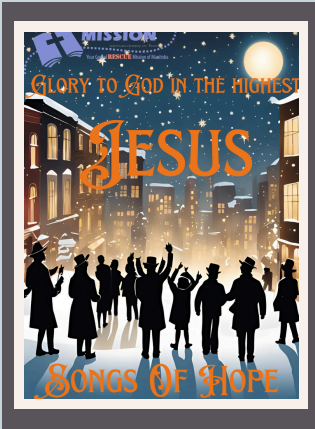
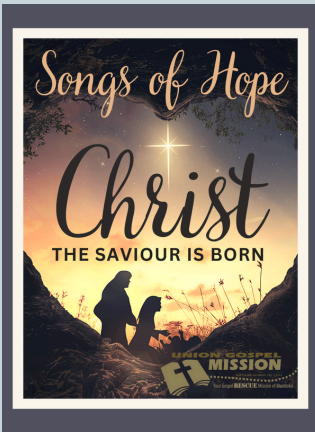

On December 19th, about 25 people set out onto the dark streets of downtown Winnipeg, heavy laden with gifts and goodies, ready to sing songs of light and joy. The sun had not gone down yet when we left the UGM building at 320 Princess Street. Yet the word ‘dark’ still very much applied. There is a spiritual

darkness on these streets. There are many precious image-bearers of God who are held in chains of bondage to addiction, who are suffering in poverty, and who do not know the fullness of joy they could experience in God's Son.

Multiple Board members, staff, volunteers, and even residents in the addictions recovery programs came together to carol in the streets of Winnipeg. We held large banners which boldly declared Christ's birth and that the Lord has come. We held candles, a physical picture of the spiritual light we sought to bring. Following the example James sets out in the 2nd chapter of his epistle, we brought far more than just spiritual nourishment. Over one hundred bags full of food and snacks were brought along, as were blankets for those in desperate need of warmth. A massive container of hot apple cider was wheeled along in a wagon and offered to all who we came across. In addition to all this, invitations to UGM's Christmas Dinner (which occurred on January 4th) were given to each person, along with information on the programs and chapels UGM offers for those in need. Paired with the tracts containing the treasure of the Gospel message inside, there was a great deal of goodness being handed out.

Perhaps the most obvious thing our group did, however, was sing. Although not a trained and practiced choir by any means,

we each sang with the joy and the ability given us by God. We sang in the drop-in centre of Siloam Mission to scores of men and women, and then made our way down Logan Avenue, singing about the joy Jesus brought to the world as we went. Singing outside both Main Street Project and the Salvation Army, we warmed up quickly at Millar College of the Bible before continuing north up Main Street, singing at bus stops and intersections all the way until we reached the Family Life Centre on Pritchard Ave. Wherever we went, we sang about Jesus, the reason for the Christmas season. We sang about this Child who was truly God in the flesh, this Anointed One whom the Jews had waited for for thousands of years, this King who came to die and redeem sinners forever.

We carollers sang of this Baby who was actually God come down, born that man no more may die, while some people right in front of us injected their bodies with drugs of death and destruction. We held up our signs and sang while some who are living in the grips of addiction and sin continued to walk by. Yet, they were outdone by the numbers who stopped to listen, and by the sounds of vehicle horns, sounding their encouragement. The light shone in the darkness: many were encouraged and drew hope from our brief interactions with them. In our two hours on the streets we did not encounter a single angry or

scornful word! Praise Jesus!

As we boldly sang these Christmas songs in the darkness, we displayed the truth that God uses the weak or foolish things of the world to accomplish His purposes (1 Cor. 1:27-28). In fact, the very God we sang about became the weakest of all: a helpless baby, born to poor parents in first century Judea. It was this baby who was actually the Creator and Saviour of all, Who held all reality in His hands. This Jesus which we sang of really is the only way to God, and the only way to freedom from the chains of addiction. The residents in UGM’s recovery program testified to this as they too sang and enthusiastically participated. One resident shared that he was now helping others and singing about Jesus on the very streets where he sold drugs for many years. What power there is in Jesus!

A Hunger For The Word

I am Karis Meikle and I have been with UGM at the Charis

Centre as a Resident Support Worker for a little over a year now. I came as an intern with Millar College of the Bible and then was hired on as full-time staff when I graduated at Millar.



Over the past few months I have been teaching a new class to the ladies in our program, called Biblical Foundations. I had a passion to teach a class like this because at the Charis Centre and UGM we believe that Christ and His Word is the foundation and completely sufficient to recovery and healing, and I love learning God’s Word and being able to teach it! I would get so many questions from the residents throughout the day about the Bible and I saw that there was an eagerness to learn about this God who we follow and serve, and the best way to learn about this God is through His Word. I started coming up with a curriculum and then began teaching the foundations of the

Bible and how the Bible works together as a whole. I wanted the ladies to learn how Jesus' story is woven all throughout the Old and New Testament; how the Bible is relevant to us today; the cultural context of the Bible and fitting all the pieces of things the ladies already knew about the Bible into the whole context of the Bible.

It has been so cool seeing the ladies come to a greater understanding of the Bible and about this God that we serve. Their questions are insightful and genuine; there have been questions about: What is salvation? Why did Jesus have to ascend into heaven? What does it mean to be godly? How were the dinosaurs destroyed? What does it mean that Jesus conquered death? What is the difference between our own fleshly desires and what Satan wants? What did Jesus mean when he said "My God My God why have You forsaken me?" So many questions that have challenged me and encouraged me to dig deep into God's Word. I have been especially encouraged by one resident,

Annette. This lady has a hunger for God's Word that inspires me. She is not afraid to ask the hard questions and together we have researched and dug into God's Word to find the answers that we can. I pray that this lady will never give up her curiosity for God and His Word and that she never stops seeking Him out and searching His Word.

I also love seeing the dots connect when the ladies are in my class. When we got to the book of Daniel we had learned the whole context leading up to the famous "Daniel in the Lion's Den" story and one resident said "whoa! I never knew that is where that story fit into the Bible!" I have witnessed some of the ladies hearing these stories



for the first time as well, which has been so neat. Their curiosity and total fascination with God's

Men's Addiction Recovery Program

Can I talk to you for a few minutes? This is a common question that I hear all day every day as a chaplain here at Union Gospel Mission. I love to hear that question because it means that our residents have been thinking about something and they want to share it with someone.

Jerry (not his real name) has been with us for over a year now. His love for God and his understanding of the gospel message has been growing by leaps and bounds. When Jerry knocks on my door and asks if he can talk with me, I know I am in for a treat. His excitement is contagious, as he relates a particular insight he had or a dream that was meaningful to him. The new life that Jerry is experiencing is truly a miracle, especially in light of the fact that he was a child of the foster care system. Being bounced around from home to home during his adolescent years took its toll on him, and he spent most of his adult life in and out of addictions. Life as he knew it was not sustainable and he decided to come to UGM for help. Jerry is currently employed as a chef for Living Bible Explorers and for Bruce Oak Recovery Center. He is a phenomenal example of what the power of God's amazing love can do in a person's life!

Adult Education

Recently a guest at Faith (Adult) Learning Centre said, "I can't believe how much you do with nothing." While there is always a need for more resources and volunteers, it's also appropriate to pause in gratitude, even as one looks and trusts faithfully with respect to the future.

Reliance on God's grace and trusting in Him is also important during setbacks. Lately I've been reviewing quarterly fiscal reports. I'm grateful too that some budget subcategories are within margin; prayer is also needed around overruns on account of a flood and a break-in recently. Thankfully the frustrated thieves left in less than two minutes, very much empty handed. Please pray for security, increased funding and for wisdom to effectively spend what we do have. (Our current grant request is being

reviewed by the province this spring.)

Grace is also very much required and in evidence as Faith Learning Centre staff bring family situations before the Lord, having to do with important 'non-school' issues that could get in the way of teaching students. Instead of seeing the 'weight' of life grinding staff down, God's grace reveals itself in the form of unexpected help from a family member or good news for a spouse at work, or appointments that bring understanding, openness, acceptance trust and hope with respect to whatever God has.

I believe this steadfast reliance of God's goodness trickles down to students in real time too. This week, for instance, on the day that our provincial site inspector came, 10 students showed up by 10 am. (Five of the eight days we've had ten too! This impressed the inspector!) Our expectation is that we can very much help some 12 or 13 of our current students to truly identify and act as regular attenders with real hopes of completion and, for a handful more to join the pack

even as we move into and through the winter months.

On average, I make about 20 attendance inquiries each week. Teachers reach out to absent students as well. Often no one picks up or replies. I wonder whether the message gets through or is appropriate, or if we’ll ever get to the point where the need to coax attendance won’t be necessary. I never question the impact and sufficiency of God’s grace, however. In agreement with this, will you please pray for a dozen or more committed students/disciples who’ve caught the vision of their divine calling and super-abundant sufficiency from God to equip them along their way. Please also pray for substitute teachers and that students would complete a record number of courses this academic year. Pray especially that Holy Spirit enthusiasm would inspire three students to graduate, not just with a Mature Student Diploma, but with an authentic testimony as well.

Finally, sometimes God’s grace comes with cake. Thanks to a



We are to fervently pray because **“The fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much.”** (James 5:16)

We talked a little about my own salvation, and the miracle that the Lord preformed in my life. We chatted a little more and she seemed to be encouraged by how all things are possible with our Lord. 

There is much to be thankful for as we have the honor of serving the Lord in the Children's Ministry. We've recently had the pleasure of a new volunteer, Jared, joining us for children's club once a week. The children love running around the gym, playing tag or some other game with him. As staff, we appreciate his high energy and the positive male influence he has on the children. Many times, the children we minister to do not have the presence of a strong male influence in their homes, due to dads not being present or they have a revolving door of men in their homes. We often notice that the children will gravitate towards the men who volunteer at club, craving whatever attention they have to offer.

While we are grateful that they appreciate the men who volunteer here, there is a level of concern, especially for the girls. As they grow older, the fear is that they will also gravitate towards any man who gives them the slightest bit of attention that feels positive, but really will lead to destruction. During our prayer time, we always ask the children how we can be praying for them and one girl consistently requests that we pray that she could see her dad. At seven years


But for many in our community, particularly the homeless, Christmas looks very different. The weather is frigid, and they face the harsh
