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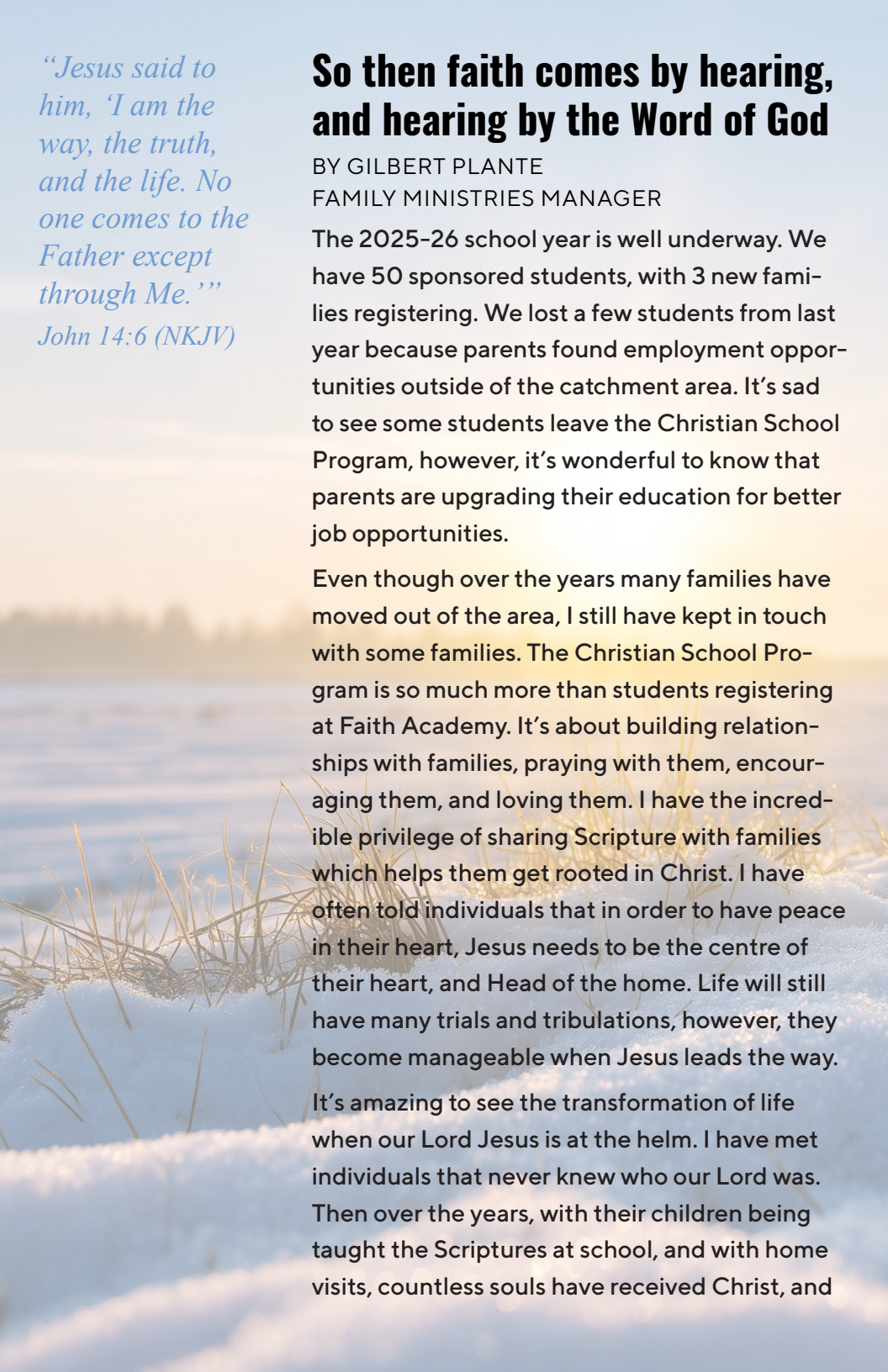

That day, we had discovered that two of our buildings on Pritchard Avenue had been ransacked. 240 Pritchard had the wiring on the back side of the building stolen while 220 Pritchard had valuable metals stolen from two HVAC units, rendering them inoperable.

Abe's response was empathetic and encouraging. He said that in situations like this our faith really is put to a test. He went on to say that we should look to the Lord and how He will work in this unfortunate situation. Abe's response certainly gave me a new perspective and caused me to look at the situation differently.

This is one of the blessings of being able to serve at UGM. We may think that we are serving others, but in fact there are times when the people we are ministering to also minister to us.

During one of the free time slots, Cora had a conversation with a camper who shared why she loves camp so much. One of her favourite things, she explained, is that camp counsellors share Jesus before turning in for the night. At home, no one does that, and she usually just stays on her iPad until she falls asleep. Moments like these remind us what a privilege it is to provide children with experiences they'll carry with them for years to come.

Another highlight from this summer came when a camper asked, "How do we get rid of sin?" The sacrifice made on the cross by Jesus Christ was then shared. Each morning at staff meetings, our team has the chance to share about meaningful conversations from the previous day. Time and again, staff would tell stories of incredible discussions, whether during cabin devotions or in everyday moments. I'm so grateful for the maturity and care our staff showed throughout the summer.

To UGM: "Your support makes all of this possible and blesses us more than you know. We are deeply thankful for your involvement in this camp!" **79 children were sponsored through UGM to attend Fisher Bay Bible Camp.**





I asked the camp director of Calvary Temple Camp if she had any camp stories to share, and a specific camper came to her mind. "He is in foster care and was quite a troubled young man. He seemed uninterested in most camp activities but willing and eager to engage with people; he seemed to crave genuine connection. The last morning of camp he woke up his counsellor at 7 am and told him that he had given his life to Jesus! His transformation was quite apparent. He wanted to own a Bible so that he could read it every day; he worried about the life and habits he'd go back to and asked for prayer. All of the staff and volunteers gathered around him and

prayed; we couldn't go with him, but Jesus would."

That is the story of so many this year: lives transformed by the living representation of the gospel in young leaders as they serve God. **98 children were sponsored through UGM to attend Calvary Temple Camp.**

Everyone who served at camp, whether through activities, chapel, food service, or cabin leading at night, played a part in fulfilling the Great Commission, as Christ commands us in Matthew 28:19-20 (ESV): **"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations... teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."**

God is so kind and His mercy is abounding, that I have the privilege to serve here. I was shy to be around the kids at first, wondered how they would be. At times I feel insecure in myself, but when I would head to Kids Club it changed; we would be greeted by such joyful little beings. Once I'd randomly been given a hug while secretly feeling sad, suddenly I felt uplifted by God's love demonstrated through His children.

One time all of the kids were outside playing, and they were doing backflips while holding on to something to support them. Most of them did it perfect and were so proud! Everyone else went inside but this one girl, Layla, not her real name, did her backflip again while we were outside. I supported her the best I could but she accidentally hit her left collarbone on the bottom of the play structure. Terrified as I was being 2 weeks on the job, I comforted her while she sobbed out of pain and I felt her pain so much that it had reminded me of the time I injured my left shoulder. Seeing the resemblance of pain, I knew in that moment that these kids are so precious and deserve the most love from us, that love which we have received from Jesus Christ.

I prayed for her to be healed in the same way Jesus healed my shoulder, as it says in John 14:14, **"Anything you ask in my name, I will do it for you."**

So I prayed for her while a few other kids huddled around comforting her, asking God to heal her in Jesus' Name, Amen. It is emotional and beautiful to see these kids develop empathy for each other over time, especially the ones who have grown up in unstable homes. Layla broke her collarbone but she continues to be healed by our Father and Jesus Christ each day, which she seems to be mostly healed by now! I am absolutely amazed to see her running around again on the playground and throwing water balloons; it is truly a miracle, and a blessing to be able to work with these kids. I am grateful to put a smile on their faces.

Thank you Jesus for healing Layla and developing these children into the way You meant them to be.

We hosted a “5-day club” with the Childhood Evangelical Fellowship from July 21-25. The kids enjoyed the **‘Intergalactic Voyage, Discovering God’s Greatness!’** theme. We are so very grateful to God’s

It is a real joy getting to know the kids. We get to see them in their good days and not so good days, and we get to show them the love, kindness, and forgiveness of our Lord Jesus in real, everyday life ways, through the support, guidance, and instruction we can give them. We remind them daily to be kind and love one another, to be respectful and obedient, and most importantly, we tell them that Jesus loves them so much. We have a diverse group of kids, with unique personalities, likes, talents, and needs. We love how different and special each child is.

God Showed Up at a Baseball Game

The men in our recovery program were in good spirits that Friday. It was a special night—we had received free tickets to a Winnipeg Goldeyes game. It was a much-needed break, a chance to relax and enjoy some fun after another challenging week on their sober journey.

As we settled into our seats, we noticed a problem starting to unfold. A group of college students seated right next to our men had already begun drinking heavily. By the third inning, every other word out of their mouths seemed to be an expletive, and they were clearly well on their way to getting drunk.

Several of our guys turned to me, visibly uncomfortable, and asked if they could return to Union Gospel Mission. The behavior around them was triggering old habits and temptations. One man said, “I didn’t stay sober for one year to mess it up at a baseball game!”

I decided we would leave. But just before I asked the group to follow me, I felt a prompting—gentle but clear. Instead of walking away, I walked over to the group of college students.

“Guys,” I began, “I don’t want to ruin your evening, and I’m not here to tell you what to do. But I work at Union Gospel Mission, a Christian recovery program. I’m here tonight with 20 guys who are working hard to stay clean from alcohol and drugs. I’m wondering if you’d be willing to help them

out—maybe take it easy on the drinking and the language for the rest of the night?”

What happened next can only be described as the presence of God. One of the young men stood up and said, “We are so sorry.” He turned to his friends, and together—without hesitation—they poured out their \$10 beers right there on the concrete. Then they left. I was stunned.

Fifteen minutes later, they returned—not with more drinks, but with **burgers, french fries, and sodas** for every single one of our guys in the recovery program. Then the same man who had spoken earlier stepped forward and said, “Guys, we admire what you’re doing so much. We wish you the best in your recovery. We apologize for our behavior. Have a great night.”

Now I ask you—what, or rather Who, was it that prompted me to go over to those men? You can’t tell me that God doesn’t show up at a Winnipeg Goldeyes baseball game.

Retirement is Not Boring

The year was 2010, and I was employed as a large power transformer designer. I had worked there for over 40 years, and the stress was beginning to wear me down. My wife had also worked there in the accounting department, but she had retired two years earlier. She kept encouraging me to retire be-

fore the job caused serious health problems. I began to consider retirement, but I thought, what would I do with my time? The job I had been doing was definitely not 9 to 5. I thought about it even when I was trying to get to sleep. I talked to several friends about retiring early, and they strongly discouraged me, saying they were often totally bored and under their wives' feet. However, there were two fellows who were enjoy-

ing retirement by volunteering. It just so happened that one of them was volunteering at the Union Gospel drop-in, and he strongly encouraged me to join him there.

So, after several interviews and the completion of the necessary paperwork, I began volunteering at the drop-in. Working at the drop-in involves preparing a hot beverage, pitchers of milk if available, plates of sandwiches and pastries, which when the door is opened, are handed out with a friendly smile and some encouraging words. The Mission also provides two shower rooms which are very welcome. However, once inside, some folks tend to want to stay inside so since there is often a line-up, it takes a little tactful persuasion to accommodate everyone.

Working at Union Gospel Mission changed my life and my attitude toward the poor, the homeless, and those addicted to various substances.

Many of us, I suspect, have driven down Main Street and past tent villages, bus shelters, etc., shaking our heads, but to meet these folks face to face breaks your heart when you have a warm home and a family to go home to.

A lawyer once approached Jesus, and testing Him, asked, **“Teacher, which is the most important commandment in the Law of Moses?”** Jesus replied, **“You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all**

Michael recently came to us with a copy of a letter he wanted us to share with the church family.



Serving Jesus Together!

Who we serve: The outcasts, the anonymous. The ostracized, the victimized, the hurting, the lonely, the addicted. One such 'outcast' penned these words: "I used to hate Christianity with a particular hate, as I felt it was this that 'did' the residential schools. I remember in jail, ripping pages from the Bible, spitting on Bibles, doing anything I could to destroy them. I hated Christianity." The same man wrote of himself: "I was this bombed out, heap of rubble in ashes, which the world would rather suffer out of sight on Main Street. Written off. A waste of time. A lost cause. A pile of garbage." Painful to read, isn't it?

Why we serve: For love of Jesus. **"I came not to call the righteous, but sinners"** (Mark 2:17). **"When you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because THEY CANNOT RE-PAY YOU..."** (Luke 14:13-14a).

Results of Serving Jesus Together: That same 'outcast' who wrote of himself in such a derogatory way now writes of Jesus, "That pile of garbage was so valuable to Him, to the Carpenter, Jesus, that He was willing to be tortured, tormented, and executed, so I may join Him in His Father's Kingdom." Jesus was baptized, and today "the old me will be drowned out and the water will break on my new birth, all because an ancient Carpenter saw value in my life. My hero is a Carpenter who rides a donkey." Jesus, Son of God, Saviour, Redeemer.
